

DRAFT NUNAVUT LAND USE PLAN TECHNICAL MEETING 4
RECOMMENDATIONS ON CARIBOU PROTECTION TO THE NPC

March 7-9 (3 Days), IQALUIT *Starting 9am*

PRIMARY OBJECTIVE IS TO MAKE PROGRESS IN FINDING:

THE MOST EFFECTIVE COMBINATION OF PROTECTED AREAS, SEASONAL RESTRICTIONS, MOBILE PROTECTION MEASURES, AND OTHER MITIGATION MEASURES TO PROTECT NUNAVUT'S CARIBOU HERDS AND CARIBOU HABITAT, WHILE FACILITATING BALANCED DEVELOPMENT FOR THE TERRITORY
